INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The fund aims to provide liquidity and stable income by investing in peso-denominated money market and fixed-income instruments with remaining terms to maturity of not more than three (3) years and has a weighted average portfolio life of one (1) year or less. The fund will track the performance of the Markit iBoxx ALBI Money Market or IBXXCHOG Index by replicating the characteristics of the benchmark.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest. This fund is suited for conservative investors with an investment horizon no more than one (1) year.

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

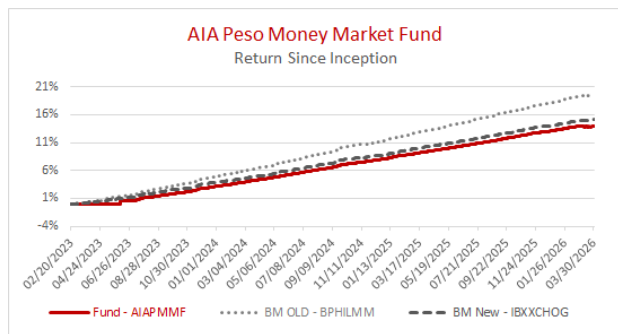

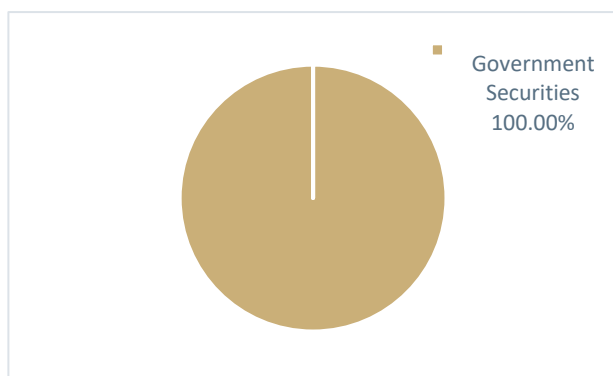

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

In Q1 2026, global and domestic macro conditions shifted materially over the course of the quarter. Relatively benign inflation conditions early in the quarter gave way to a sharper reassessment in March, as renewed geopolitical tensions in the Middle East reignited energy-driven inflation pressures and narrowed the scope for further monetary easing.

Headline inflation averaged 2.8% during the quarter, remaining within the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas' (BSP) 2–4% target band. Inflation dynamics, however, deteriorated sharply in March, with headline inflation rising to 4.1% year on year, breaching the target range for the first time since mid-2024. The upside was led by fuel-related pass-through to transport, electricity, and related services, while core inflation firmed, pointing to early broadening pressures.

Domestic growth remained soft, with GDP slowing to 3.0% year on year in Q4 2025, weighed down by weaker government construction spending and softer household consumption. In response to subdued growth conditions, the BSP delivered a 25-basis-point policy rate cut earlier in the quarter. However, in anticipation of heightened inflation risks toward quarter-end, the central bank convened an off-cycle meeting and kept the policy rate unchanged, underscoring the supply-driven nature of inflation and revising its outlook toward higher inflation and slower growth.

Peso bond yields rose broadly across the curve, with benchmark rates closing the quarter as follows:

- 6.03% for the 2-year (+68 bps)
- 6.72% for the 5-year (+95 bps)
- 6.97% for the 10-year (+91 bps)
- 7.01% for the 20-year (+60 bps)

Looking ahead, the balance of risks has shifted. While economic growth remains subdued, elevated energy prices and the risk of broader inflation pass-through limit the BSP's scope for near-term easing, keeping short-term rates sensitive to incoming data. Policy decisions are expected to remain highly data dependent, with inflation trends and global developments playing a decisive role. In this environment, the fund will prioritize capital preservation and liquidity, maintaining a conservative positioning and taking a selective approach to tenor placement amid near-term volatility.

⁵ Volatility measures the degree to which the Fund fluctuates vis-à-vis its own average return over a period of time (standard deviation of returns).

⁶ Tracking Error is the volatility of the returns of the Fund over and below the returns of its corresponding benchmark (BPHILMM INDEX from inception to April 30, 2024 and IBXXCHOG INDEX from May 01, 2024) (standard deviation of excess returns of the Fund vis-à-vis its benchmark). The lower the Tracking Error, the closer the Fund's composition is vis-à-vis its benchmark. A Tracking Error equal to 0% means the Fund is fully replicated to its benchmark.
