AIA GLOBAL MULTI-FACTOR EQUITY FUND

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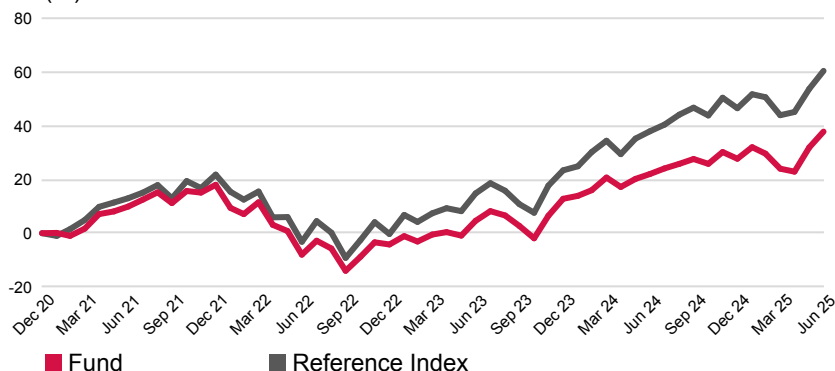
INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE and POLICY

The Sub-Fund aims to provide long-term investment growth through exposure to a diversified portfolio of global equities and equity-related securities that exhibit various investment factor characteristics. The Sub-Fund will seek to achieve its investment objective by investing primarily, i.e. at least 50% of its Net Asset Value, in equities and equity-related securities, including but not limited to, warrants, convertible notes, convertible preference shares, convertible senior subordinated notes, mandatory convertible preference shares, common shares, rights issues and depositary receipts (American Depositary Receipts (ADRs) and Global Depositary Receipts (GDRs)), of companies worldwide that exhibit the characteristics of certain investment factors that drive the long-term return of equities. The Sub-Fund will gain exposure to a range of investment factors (also commonly known as investment styles) that may include low volatility, momentum, quality, value and small cap.

The Sub-Fund described herein is indexed to an MSCI index.

COMMENTARY

Global equity markets advanced in June, capping a robust second-quarter performance despite a range of macroeconomic and geopolitical headwinds. Markets staged an impressive recovery as the United States (U.S.) administration softened its trade stance, pausing reciprocal tariffs and laying the groundwork for bilateral agreements. This policy pivot, combined with resilient corporate earnings, easing inflation, and receding recession fears, helped restore investor confidence. Geopolitical tensions, including renewed instability in the Middle East, were largely overlooked by markets as risk appetite returned.

The AIA Global Multi Factor Equity Fund returned 4.51% for June, outperforming its reference index (MSCI World Index) by 20 basis points (bps).

Information Technology and Communication Services reclaiming dominance towards the end of the quarter. These sectors were buoyed by strong earnings and upbeat guidance from artificial intelligence (AI)-linked mega caps such as Nvidia and Meta, reigniting enthusiasm for secular growth themes. Financials also outperformed, aided by curve steepening and long-end rate movements, while Real Estate trailed in comparison. Defensive sectors such as Utilities, Consumer Staples and Health Care lagged in the risk-on environment. Energy was the weakest sector, weighed down by elevated oil price volatility. Although Brent briefly spiked to \$80/barrel after the U.S. intervention in Iran, prices retraced to end the quarter near \$68, pressured by increased Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) supply.

From a style factor perspective, growth stocks outperformed, driven by a sharp rebound in U.S. large-cap tech, with the “Magnificent 7” delivering notable returns. Momentum Factor also gained ground, supported by sustained leadership in AI and technology-related names. In contrast, Value Factor underperformed as sectors like Energy and Health Care lagged. The Size Factor contributed modestly, with small caps outperforming large caps through June and the quarter overall. Minimum Volatility Factor trailed in the risk-friendly backdrop, while Quality Factor delivered mixed results, as earnings strength in mega caps offset weaker performance from traditional defensives.

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
