

AIA INVESTMENT FUNDS AIA GLOBAL QUALITY GROWTH FUND

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INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE and POLICY

The Sub-Fund seeks to provide investors returns comprising capital growth and dividend income over the long term by investing primarily in global equities and equity-related securities worldwide. In order to achieve its investment objective, the Sub-Fund will invest primarily, i.e. at least 50% of the Sub-Fund's Net Asset Value, in equity securities and equity related securities of companies globally which demonstrates potential of quality growth in the long term. The Sub-Investment manager will adopt a long term investment horizon and will look at indicators such as the long term strategic direction and culture of a company, capital allocation, skill of the management team and their level of alignment with shareholders to identify companies which in their opinion is running the business for the long term. The Sub-Fund will invest primarily in listed equity securities and equity related securities including, but not limited to, common shares, preference shares, warrants, rights issues and depositary receipts (American Depository Receipts (ADRs) and Global Depository Receipts (GDRs)).

The Sub-Fund described herein is indexed to an MSCI index.

COMMENTARY

Global equity markets rose in October, supported by the Federal Reserve's decision to cut interest rates and continued resilience in U.S. corporate earnings and economic activity. Although tensions between the U.S. and China over critical minerals briefly unsettled markets, sentiments improved following signs of diplomatic progress. Market leadership remains narrow, dominated by a handful of large U.S. technology firms whose share prices have been fueled by optimism around artificial intelligence (AI). Some market participants turned more cautious late in the month as scrutiny grew over the heavy, increasingly debt-funded investment plans of certain companies in this area.

For the month, the AIA Global Quality Growth Fund delivered -0.13%, lagging the MSCI All Country World Index by 2.39%. While disappointing in relative terms, the Fund views this as a temporary setback as the companies continue to perform strongly and strengthen their long-term competitive positions.

Alphabet Inc. ("Alphabet") was among the top contributors after reporting record third-quarter results, surpassing \$100 billion in quarterly revenue for the first time, up 16% year-on-year. Its cloud business grew 34%, while advertising revenues remained robust, helped by the integration of new AI features that enhance content engagement and relevance with users. Alphabet continues to generate strong cash flows while reinvesting heavily in next-generation digital infrastructure and AI capabilities, reinforcing its long-term advantage in intelligent information services.

Illumina, Inc ("Illumina"), a long-term holding that has faced operational challenges in the recent past, had a strong month following better-than-expected earnings. The rollout of its latest NovaSeq X sequencers is progressing well, with 75% of high-throughput sequencing volume and 51% of high-throughput revenue coming from the new platform. Illumina also showed that once clinical customers transition to the X platform, they typically expand their use of consumables, demonstrating the strength and stickiness of demand for genomic sequencing. The Fund is encouraged by Illumina's execution in this important area and views it as a meaningful step as it looks to consolidate its leadership in the essential tools of the genomic revolution.

Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company (TSMC) also performed well following strong quarterly results. Revenues grew 41% year-on-year to \$33 billion, driven by ongoing demand for cutting-edge chips used in AI and advanced computing. The company continues to operate at full capacity for its most advanced nodes and remains on schedule to begin volume production of its 2-nanometer process in 2026. Chips manufactured using this technology will be faster and more energy efficient, promoting technological innovation and helping customers transition to smarter, lower-carbon technologies.

On detractors, Savers Value Village declined despite posting solid results. Samestore sales accelerated in both the U.S. and Canada, and new store openings continued apace. However, conservative fourth-quarter company guidance in Canada, amid signs of a slowing economy, unsettled investors. The Fund believes this reaction was overly cautious and that Savers remains well-placed to benefit from the growing trend towards circular consumption in fashion, helping extend product lifecycles, reduce waste and promote more sustainable consumer behavior.

Novo Nordisk's share price weakened after the announcement that its chair and board would step down following a disagreement with its majority shareholder, the Novo Nordisk Foundation, over the pace and direction of growth for the business. While such changes can cause short-term uncertainty, the Fund is encouraged that the Foundation is pushing for greater ambition and agility in expanding the company's GLP-1 franchise. The Fund sees a long runway ahead as Novo explores applications of its treatments across metabolic and cardiovascular health, in addition to their current use cases in diabetes and weight loss.

Finally, not holding Nvidia Corporation ("Nvidia") detracted from relative performance as its valuation continued to rise. The Fund sold its position in mid-2024 following a period of strong share price appreciation. At the time, it viewed that market expectations for the company had become stretched and that the industry's cyclicality and growing competition warranted caution.

The near-term backdrop remains challenging. Equity markets remain dominated by near-term narratives and episodic volatility. Yet, the Fund's philosophy is to look

through such periods and focus on businesses with enduring growth potential. While Al continues to capture investor attention, the Fund believes other transformative areas, such as improving health outcomes and sustainable consumption and critical resource use, are underappreciated. The companies addressing these challenges are not only creating meaningful societal value but, in the Fund's view, are laying the foundations for superior and more sustainable long-term returns.

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
