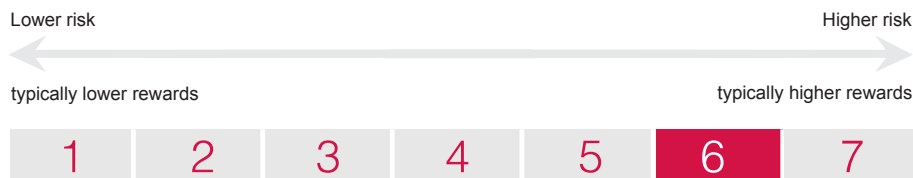
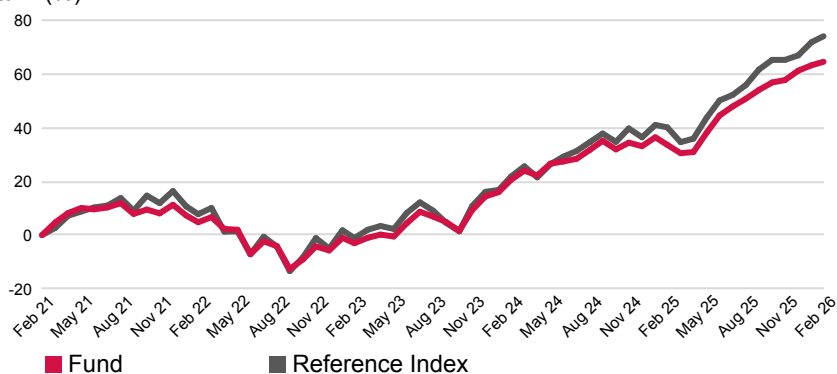
INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE and POLICY

The Sub-Fund aims to provide income through a portfolio of global equities and equity-related securities with a covered call strategy to enhance income generation. In order to achieve its investment objective, the Sub-Fund will invest primarily, i.e. at least 50% of the Sub-Fund's Net Asset Value, in equity securities and equity-related securities issued by companies globally selected for their income and / or growth potential and call options writing.

The Sub-Fund described herein is indexed to an MSCI index.

COMMENTARY

Global equities advanced in February. Geopolitical tensions surged after the U.S. and Israel commenced military strikes on Iran, killing Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei and other senior leaders of the Islamic Republic's regime. These actions triggered retaliatory attacks by Iran across the Middle East, including civilian infrastructure within Gulf Cooperation Council states. The unknown scale and duration of the conflict added new risks for the global economy and upended energy markets, fuelling anxiety about a potential resurgence in inflation across the globe. Monetary policy continued to diverge among key central banks. The Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) raised interest rates due to a solid economy and renewed inflation pressures; the European Central Bank (ECB) signalled a prolonged pause in rate cuts amid significantly below-forecast inflation; the Bank of Japan (BOJ) is on track to gradually tighten policy; and the Bank of England (BOE) and the U.S. Federal Reserve (Fed) remained on course to ease policy rates this year. The U.S. Supreme Court struck down tariffs that President Donald Trump imposed under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA), including the April 2025 "reciprocal" tariffs. However, the U.S. government quickly replaced the invalidated tariffs with a new 10% global tariff to maintain its protectionist trade agenda. Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi led her Liberal Democratic Party to a landslide victory in a snap election, securing a supermajority in Parliament that gives her a stronger mandate to implement her conservative agenda.

The AIA Equity Income Fund returned 0.77% for the month, modestly underperformed its benchmark by 0.52%. Regional exposure to Japan and North America detracted most from relative performance, whilst exposure to Developed EU & Middle East ex UK and Emerging Markets contributed. From a sector perspective, exposure to Information Technology and Materials detracted most from relative performance, whilst exposure to Consumer Discretionary and Healthcare contributed. Allocations to U.S. covered call writing detracted from absolute performance, whilst allocation to global low volatility income equities (ex U.S.) contributed positively.

The Fund's underweight exposure to Samsung Electronics detracted over the period. Shares of Samsung Electronics, a South Korea-based semiconductor and consumer electronics company, advanced during the month after the company announced the beginning of mass production and commercial shipments of its HBM4 chips. Additional reports that Samsung is seeking up to 30% higher pricing for its latest chips further contributed to the stock's price.

The overweight exposure to Edison International contributed to positive relative performance. Shares of Edison International, a U.S.-based public utility holding company, rose in February 2026, supported by investor reaction to the company's stronger-than-expected fourth-quarter 2025 earnings and improved financial visibility following earnings released mid-month.

The Fund increased its overweight exposure to Consumer Staples while decreasing its overweight to Real Estate, which continues to be the largest overweight. It increased its underweight exposure to Information Technology, which continues to be the Fund's largest underweight. It increased its underweight position in the United Kingdom while decreasing its underweight in North America, which continues to be its largest underweight. The Fund decreased its overweight in Emerging Markets during the month, which continues to be its largest overweight.
