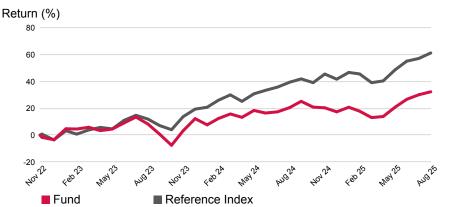
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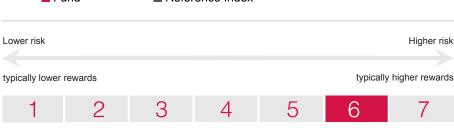
INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE and POLICY

The Sub-Fund's sustainable investment objective is to advance the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals ("UN SDGs") by investing indirectly, through investments in other UCITS funds or sub-funds, in companies whose business models and operational practices are aligned with targets defined by the seventeen (17) UN SDGs on a multi-thematic basis. In addition to pursuing the sustainable investment objective, the Sub-Fund at the same time aims to provide long term capital growth.

The Sub-Fund described herein is indexed to an MSCI index.

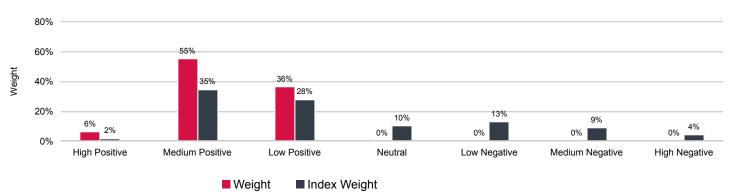

Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Scores



This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco's SDG Framework. The frameworks, which utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company's impact alignment with the relevant SDGs, provides a methodology for assigning companies with an SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. This results in a 7-step scale from -3 to +3. If the data set does not cover the full portfolio, the figures shown above each impact level sum to the coverage level to reflect the data coverage of the portfolio, with minimal deviations that reflect rounding. Weights < 0.5% will show as 0. If an index has been selected, the same figures are also provided for the index. Holdings mapped as corporates and/or sovereign are included in the figures.

COMMENTARY

Strong earnings, moderating inflation and expectations of lower interest rates supported equities in August. Small caps outperformed large cap stocks, supported by U.S. rate cut expectations as Federal Reserve Chair Powell made it clear in a much-anticipated speech that he is ready to cut rates due to deterioration in the labor market. In the U.S., the policy landscape cleared for renewable energy especially solar after the adoption of Trump's One Big Beautiful Bill Act where the most important tax credits will stay.

The AIA Sustainable Multi-Thematic Fund rose 1.66% in August and underperformed its benchmark by 0.95%. The risk-on sentiment, that drove markets higher since mid-April, took a breather although earnings, especially in the U.S., have been solid and led to upward revisions. China equities, especially domestic Chinese A-shares made a comeback as the fund has a 3.7% position in China that became the main driver of positive country allocation contribution. Across sectors, Industrials and Technology lagged the market in August while Materials performed well, supported by positive economic surprises. Stock selection contributed negatively, driven by weak stock selection in Healthcare and Consumer Staples. Amongst the themes, Smart Mobility and Smart Materials have rebounded sharply since May, along with New World Financials and Smart Energy. The Circular Economy theme marked time after a strong performance so far this year.

Breadth of the Fund has improved since including Financials as a new sector, along with risk management versus its benchmark. At the same time, the Fund will continue to show strong sustainability characteristics with all its holdings contributing positively to the UN Sustainable Development Goals. Equity markets remain on an upward trend, supported by a resilient macroeconomic backdrop and positive economic surprises, especially from the U.S. strong corporate earnings across the U.S., Europe, and Japan, along with ongoing trade deals, have helped maintain market optimism, alongside their continued focus on the near-term benefit of lower rates while largely ignoring the longer-term risk of diminished central bank independence.

Tariffs remain a central risk. The latest announcements reminded investors of the uncertainty, but new trade agreements also reinforced confidence that the eventual tariff regime may prove less aggressive than feared. Corporate earnings have yet to show significant damage, as many companies front-loaded supplies and reorganized supply chains. The Fund expects tariffs to eventually weigh-on margins, particularly as consumers resist higher prices and pass through is less prominent than post lockdowns. U.S. labor market data underscores this caution with wage growth running at roughly 3.5% year-on-year, but broader dynamics point to cooling. Policy support remains a key counterweight. The Fund remains cautiously positioned but maintains a slight long-beta tilt. The outlook is clouded by future margin risks, but strong earnings and continued support from Al-related momentum, justify staying invested. The preference is to favor emerging markets over developed markets, given attractive valuations and a weaker USD.

The Fund allocates to eight sustainable themes that include stocks in the portfolio that are leaders in the sustainability revolution that is taking place and are selected to have positive impact on achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals. It has heavier allocations in sectors like the Information Technology, Industrials, Healthcare, Materials and Financial, while remains relatively light in Consumer stocks.

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
