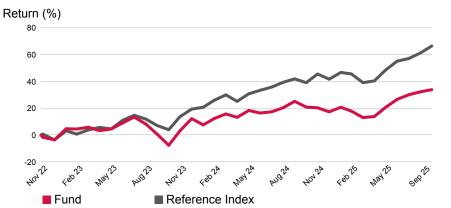
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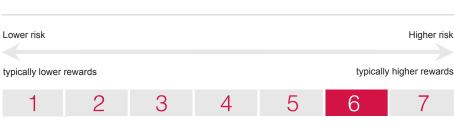
INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE and POLICY

The Sub-Fund's sustainable investment objective is to advance the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals ("UN SDGs") by investing indirectly, through investments in other UCITS funds or sub-funds, in companies whose business models and operational practices are aligned with targets defined by the seventeen (17) UN SDGs on a multi-thematic basis. In addition to pursuing the sustainable investment objective, the Sub-Fund at the same time aims to provide long term capital growth.

The Sub-Fund described herein is indexed to an MSCI index.

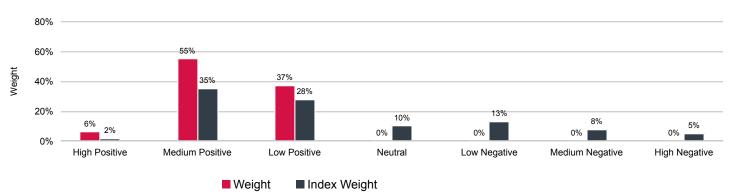

Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Scores



This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco's SDG Framework. The frameworks, which utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company's impact alignment with the relevant SDGs, provides a methodology for assigning companies with an SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. This results in a 7-step scale from -3 to +3. If the data set does not cover the full portfolio, the figures shown above each impact level sum to the coverage level to reflect the data coverage of the portfolio, with minimal deviations that reflect rounding. Weights < 0.5% will show as 0. If an index has been selected, the same figures are also provided for the index. Holdings mapped as corporates and/or sovereign are included in the figures.

COMMENTARY

September 2025 defied its historically weak seasonality, with the S&P 500 rising 3.5% and the Nasdaq Composite advancing 5.4%, both reaching new record highs. The rally was fuelled by the Federal Reserve's first rate cut, resilient economic data, and continued enthusiasm for artificial intelligence (AI) related sectors. European markets lagged under economic and political pressures, while investors largely dismissed risks from a potential U.S. government shutdown and new tariffs. Rising earnings expectations and large AI-driven capital orders further buoyed sentiment.

Emerging markets again outperformed developed peers, supported by China's policy stimulus and attractive valuations. The risk-on environment benefited high-yield and emerging-market debt. U.S. Treasury yields dipped after the Fed cut rates, though long-dated bonds faced pressure from debt-sustainability concerns. Investment-grade credit tightened, and gold hit new records amid geopolitical tensions and easier monetary conditions. Oil prices eased slightly on supply-glut worries.

The AIA Sustainable Multi-Thematic Fund gained 1.22% in September, underperforming the MSCI World Index by 1.99%. Cyclicals saw solid gains while defensives made only modest progress. Renewed enthusiasm around AI fuelled a sharp rebound in semiconductor names and lifted larger companies, particularly the Magnificent Seven. Growth shares again outpaced Value, and U.S markets continued to lead their European peers. The Fund benefited from effective country positioning, especially in China and Taiwan, though stock selection weighed slightly, largely due to limited exposure to mega-cap technology and softer results in Materials and Financials.

Strong stock performers included Contemporary Amperex Technology Co., Limited (CATL) (+32%) on improving China sentiment, Celestica (up over threefold since April on Al orders), Hudbay Minerals (+26%) from rising copper and gold prices, and Schneider Electric on margin guidance. Laggards were Sprouts Farmers Market (–23%) on slower growth guidance and Sensient Technologies (–17%) after tempered management outlook. Underweights in Alphabet, Apple, and Tesla also hurt relative returns.

The artificial intelligence (AI) theme remains a major tailwind. China offers attractive alternatives to U.S. AI exposure at lower valuations. The U.S. economy shows resilient consumption but softer manufacturing and labour data. Inflation is sticky, yet the Fed prioritized growth with its rate cut, driving a flatter yield curve. Steady growth, easing policy, and potential fiscal stimulus raise odds of a "high-pressure" economy, reflected in commodity and gold rallies. Global policies remain accommodative across the U.S., Europe, Japan, and China.

Risks persist, from geopolitical tensions to tariffs and elevated valuations but current earnings revisions signal resilience. The Fund remains constructive on equities, favoring emerging markets with cheaper valuations and stronger currencies.

The Fund continues to hold stocks that are leaders in the sustainability revolution that is taking place and are selected to have positive impact on achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals. The Fund currently has heavy weights in Information Technology, Industrials, Healthcare, and Materials, with Financials now comprising nearly 15% of the allocation. Exposure to Consumer sectors remains relatively modest.

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
