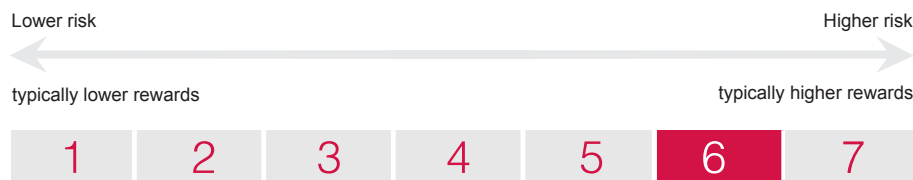
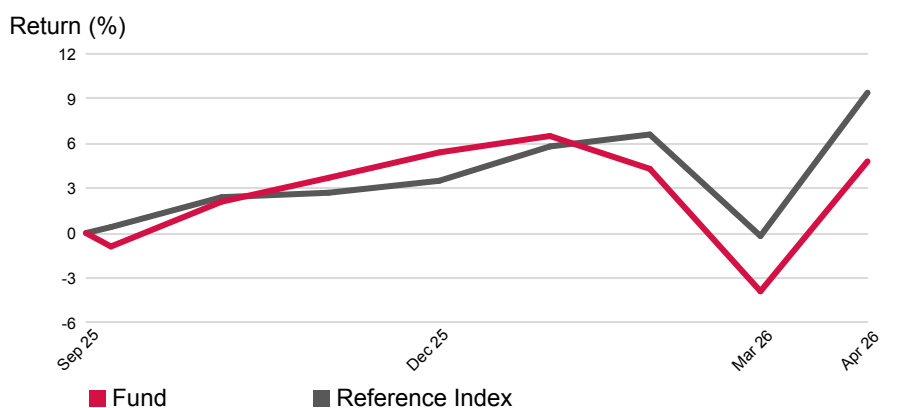
AIA WORLD QUALITY EQUITY FUND

COMMENTARY

The AIA World Quality Equity Fund returned 9.04%, underperforming its benchmark by 0.55%. The Fund's underweight allocations on Energy and Materials, and overweight on Information Technology made positive relative returns while overweight allocations in Consumer Staples and Healthcare detracted. Security selection within sectors, modestly added to relative returns this month. Selection results in Consumer Discretionary, Healthcare and Communication Services made the largest positive relative returns. Information Technology, Industrials and Financials detracted from relative returns. Sector allocation detracted more than Security selection added. The non-U.S. underweight, relative to MSCI World, modestly added from the regional allocation aspect of attribution this month. The U.S. overweight, relative to MSCI World, also moderately added from the regional allocation aspect of attribution last month. The non-U.S. allocation added more than the U.S. allocation.

Shares of Texas Instruments Incorporated outperformed as results and outlook reinforced resilience in analog semiconductor demand, with inventory digestion progressing more favorably than expected. The company also benefited from improved sentiment toward cyclical sectors. The share performance of UnitedHealth Group Incorporated was supported by stable earnings expectations and continued strength in the services segment, offsetting near-term medical cost noise. A focus on profitability and improved earnings visibility was rewarded, contributing positively relative to the benchmark. Lam Research Corporation benefited from improving expectations for memory and advanced logic spending where operating leverage to a capex recovery and broader semiconductor strength tied to AI compute demand further drove strong relative performance.

Bottom Contributors include Johnson & Johnson despite solid fundamentals following a strong run-up last year and in 1Q, as valuations expanded. The stock's defensive profile also underperformed amid a rotation toward more cyclical exposures. Shares of Abbott Laboratories underperformed amid concerns around slower growth in core medical devices and diagnostics, alongside margin normalization, along with relative pressure as Healthcare lagged the broader equity market during the period. Shares of Thermo Fisher Scientific Inc. detracted as soft biopharma and academic end-market demand weighed on near-term growth expectations where its results reinforced a slower funding recovery outlook, leading to multiple contraction and relative underperformance.
