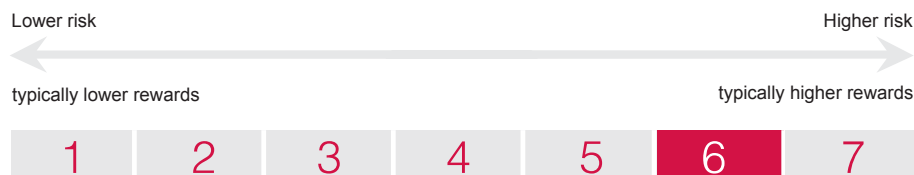
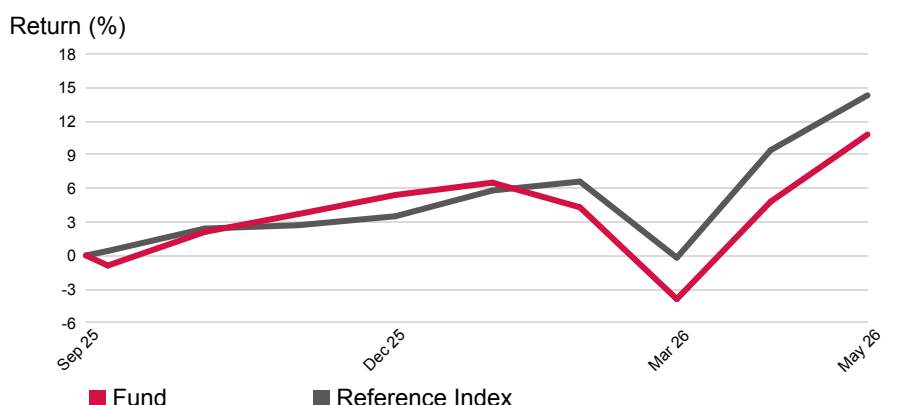
## AIA WORLD QUALITY EQUITY FUND

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### INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE and POLICY

The Sub-Fund aims to generate total return through investment in global equities and equity-related securities the Sub Investment Manager believes to be of high quality. The Sub-Fund will invest at least 80% of its Net Asset Value in global equities and equity-related securities the Sub Investment Manager believes to be of high quality.

### PERFORMANCE

MAIN RISKS

## COMMENTARY

The AIA World Quality Equity Fund returned 5.72%, outperforming its benchmark by 1.16%. Relative to the MSCI World Index, sector allocation added to relative returns this month. The Information Technology (overweight), Energy (underweight), and Financials (underweight) allocations made positive relative returns, while Health Care (overweight), Communication Services (overweight), and Consumer Staples (overweight) detracted. Security selection within sectors detracted from relative returns this month. Selection results in Industrials and Consumer Discretionary made the largest positive relative returns, while Information Technology, Financials, and Health Care detracted. Security selection detracted more than sector allocation added. The non-U.S. underweight, relative to the MSCI World Index, added to the regional allocation aspect of attribution this month, while the U.S. overweight also contributed positively, with the non-U.S. allocation contributing more overall.

Lam Research Corporation (“Lam Research”) contributed positively, as semiconductor equipment stocks benefited from continued artificial intelligence (AI)-related capital expenditure (capex) expectations and improving memory investment trends. The company also benefited from strong expectations for wafer fabrication demand growth and sustainability, as well as ongoing strength in advanced semiconductor manufacturing. Microsoft Corporation (“Microsoft”) outperformed as continued growth in cloud and AI-related revenues supported earnings expectations and reinforced the company’s strong competitive positioning. The stock also benefited from resilient enterprise technology spending and investor preference for high-quality large-cap technology companies. Safran S.A. (“Safran”) contributed positively as aerospace and defence stocks benefited from strong civil aviation demand and ongoing aftermarket recovery, with exposure to engine servicing and improving commercial aerospace production, alongside easing geopolitical concerns, supporting share price performance during the month.

Micron Technology, Inc. (“Micron Technology”) detracted from relative performance as shares rallied on improving memory pricing expectations and sustained AI-driven demand. While the Fund does not hold Micron Technology, the recent earnings strength appears largely price-led, supported by tight supply, dynamics that may prove difficult to sustain. The absence of a position in Advanced Micro Devices, Inc. (“AMD”) also detracted from relative performance, as the company benefited from ongoing demand for AI and data centre semiconductor exposure, with improving expectations for central processing unit (CPU) demand driven by agentic AI adoption and server-related revenue growth supporting strong share price gains during the month. Constellation Brands, Inc. Class A (“Constellation Brands”) detracted amid weaker Consumer Staples performance and softer demand trends across parts of the liquor industry, with the stock additionally pressured by concerns around consumer spending, input cost pressures, and a more challenging near-term volume outlook.
